Dear Candidate,

Further to the announcement that you intend to contest a seat in the upcoming elections, I would like to invite you to a briefing on the Freedom of Information Law and the practical operation of that legislation. You will be aware that the FOI Law was passed in 2007, and came into effect in January of 2009, when Mrs. Jennifer Dilbert was appointed as Cayman's first Information Commissioner. Upon her retirement in 2014, HE the Governor appointed me as Acting Information Commissioner, a role I have fulfilled since then.

Freedom of Information (FOI) remains as current a topic today as it was when the Law first came into effect. As you will know, the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO) is now preparing to merge with the Office of the Complaints Commissioner (OCC) and others into a single Office of the Ombudsman. In addition, our office has been working with the Hon. Attorney General to prepare the Data Protection Bill, which was recently passed in the Legislative Assembly.

In my view FOI remains a fundamental tool for upholding good governance and human rights, and I believe it is a topic that each candidate in the upcoming election, and even more importantly, all legislators, should have a good understanding of.

We would be happy to spend some time with you, provide you with a good grounding in the Law, and try to answer any questions you may have.
